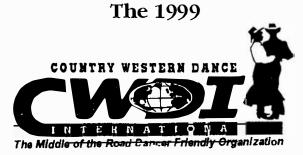

# JOHN NEEL, UCWDC EVENT PRODUCER, DIES

Yesterday afternoon, my friends JOHN & JOSIE NEEL drove from their home in South Hill VA to Harrisburg PA to spend a week here with me and help me prepare for my event. They arrived at a nearby campground a little after midnight, Wednesday morning Oct. 21, 1998. While they were walking arm-inarm through the campground scouting for a site for their motorhome, John suffered a major trauma, probably a massive heart attack, and fell over backwards. Josie administered CPR and mouth-to-mouth resuscitation on John while other campers called paramedics, then me.

The paramedics worked hard on John for over half an hour and transported him to Harrisburg Hospital where he was pronounced dead on arrival. The hospital staff was very supportive and comforting. The Doctor told us that John was dead before he hit the ground and had not suffered in the least.

Since John was a Catholic, a priest was called. He came and gave John his last rites. The Chief looked very peaceful. Later, Josie said they had enjoyed a wonderful, leisurely and happy trip up on a glorious day.

Josie's brother BILL SCROGGS, his wife TERESA and their family came to Harrisburg and have taken Josie back to their home in Virginia.

As a retired U.S. Navy Chief, John will be interred at Arlington National Cemetery later this week.

John, who was fifty years of age, is survived by daughter Cyndee, his father, several sisters and brothers, his wife Josie and thousands of friends. The UCWDC, the C/W Dance Community and I all lost a good friend and an honest, hard working Director last night. 1, for one, will miss him a great deal. Before she left, Josie shared with me that she knows that her beloved husband is in a far better place today.

Thank you...

I would like to thank the many readers for your cards, calls, prayers, and 'get well' wishes about my recent battle with cancer. The good news is that with the help of the chemo and radiation, etc. the cancer seems to be gone and I'm back up to steam at work here at *CDL*.

#### About "Aug./Sep.", "Oct./Nov." and now, "Dec./Jan."

This is the third issue since my getting back to work and it carries the name of two months just as the previous two did. Here is the significance of this two-month thing.

On the outset, the most recent information we have is the information that we included into each issue regardless of the name of the month(s) on that issue. Late last spring we sent the July issue to press just before I became unable to work. When I finally got back to work, we put together an issue and called it the August/September 1998 issue. That issue was put into the mails on November 5, 1998 which most of you didn't receive until close to December.

The reason we called that issue August (instead of December) is because our subscription records are kept in terms of month and year. Somewhere on your address label you'll see something to the effect of "JUL99". This means that the last issue of your current subscription is the July 1999 issue. In order to keep our records straight, we couldn't skip a month or more and call that "Aug./Sep." issue "December" as this would leave a 4 issue hole in your subscription, so

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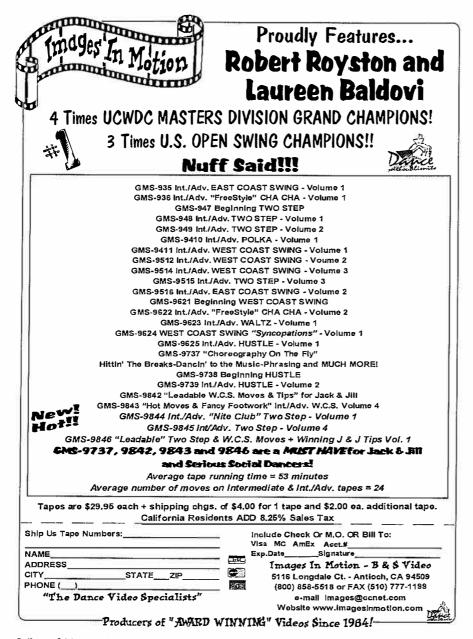
# 7TH ANNUAL SILVER STATE C/W DNACE FESTIVAL

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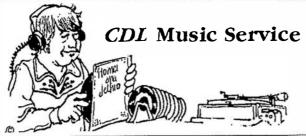

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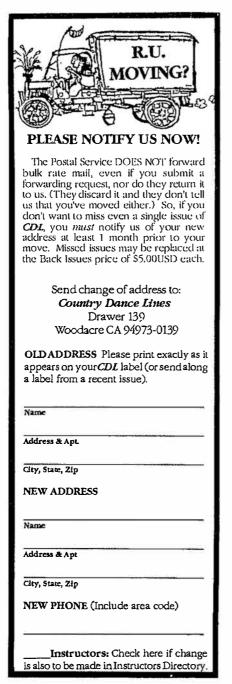

It has been awesome to turn my passion into the way I make my living, and I look forward to receiving Country Dance Lines Magazine.

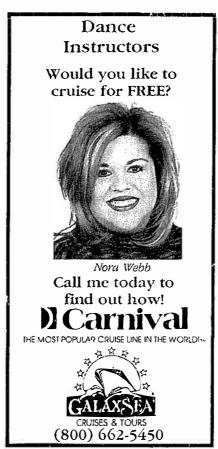

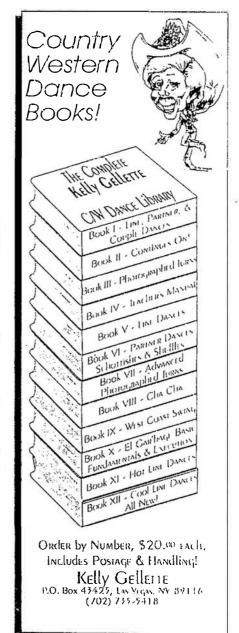

## More on BPM and Rhythm.

A reader wrote that she felt that CDL should be adamant about requiring BPM (Beats Per Minute) to be included with step descriptions. She further writes, "After all, you are the one publisher of Compact Disc and Tape reviews who made us aware of BPM". (She also wants us to put the quotation marks before (or is it after?) the period, but that's an article for "Country Dance Punctuation" magazine.)

We do include BPM for dances when the choreographer includes them, although we don't double check them for accuracy. Otherwise, we've never considered listing BPM for line dances to be all that helpfull, especially without identifying a specific couples dance category.

For teaching/learning, practicing and/or performing a line or fixed pattern partner dance, BPM, without a dance category are useless, and with a dance category BPM are unnecessary. In couples dancing, all dances have about a 20 BPM window for dancing. This is no different with line and partner pattern dancing although line and partner pattern dance usually uses a song with a slower speed for teaching/learning, a slightly faster speed for practicing and an even faster speed for performing. Sometimes when a faster song is used

for a certain dance it's because the dancers are either more advanced or physically more able to do the dance faster. Of course it can be argued that there's a point where the faster and faster tempo of the music can turn "dancing" into nothing more than "exercising"

On the other hand, when the dancers are beginners or less physically able, a slower tempo song may be more appropriate.

Therefore, the BPM for the music for

line and partner dance can often be determined by the condition of the dancers on the floor.

We prefer (and request of the choreographers) that the dance category of music be identified rather than the BPM.

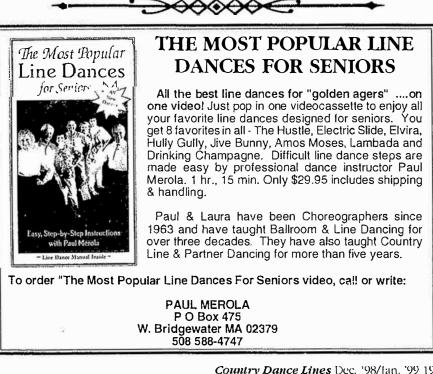
If you haven't heard the 124BPM song suggested for the dance, what song do you play instead by knowing only that it's 124BPM

We would rather know if the suggested rbythm of the music is West Coast Swing, Triple Two-step, Cha Cha, Polka, Shuffle, Schottische, etc.? All of these rhythms are very different from one another, yet 124BPM is within the "window" for all of these categories,

Unless the dance is a "routine" choreographed to one specific version of one certain song, it is a dis-service to a dance to identify it too strongly with any one song because once that song dies out, so does the dance. This is why we have such classic dances such as Tush Push, Walkin' Wazi, and so many others. It's simply because they can be danced to several rhythms and tempos. And, if there are songs called Tush Push or Walkin' Wazi, they were named for the dance, not the other way around as is usually the case.

We also ask choreographers to include at least three song suggestions with their dance in the hope that you'll be familiar with at least one of them and can substitute other songs within that category if you don't have (or get tired of) the suggested music.

A large part of the popularity of C/W dancing is due to the continual flow of new songs that go to the same old rhythms but are a little bit faster or a little bit slower than the previous song.

o'clock it was time to close the ballrooms, and for the diehards, unable to sleep, it meant off to the Squire's Retreat for more fun and dancing into the morning.

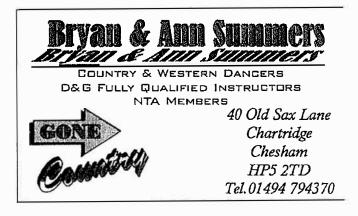

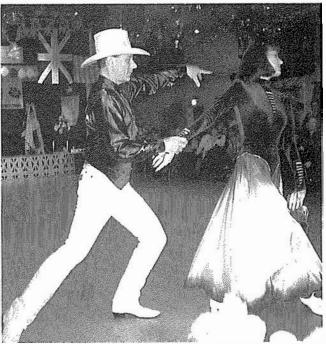

# THE 5TH ANNUAL CRAZY COUNTRY DANCE FESTIVAL IN JAPAN

This past November 21st and 23rd the Crazy Country Dance Festival was held in Komaki (near Nagoya), Japan. This year's special guest instructor was GREG UNDERWOOD from Cincinnati, Ohio. This choreographer of such well known renown dances as West Coast Shuffle and Crazy Legs (a dance which for obvious reasons is dear to our hearts). The club sponsoring the festival was Nagoya C/W Dance Fans "Crazy Feet".

The special quest instructors for our 3rd CCDF were SCOTT & DEBORAH BLEVINS and for our 4th CCDF they were JO THOMPSON & TIM SZYMANSKI. So as you can imagine, Greg had a tough act to follow. In fact, some people were worried that he wouldn't be able to live up to his predecessors. Fortunately, he was exactly what we had hoped for and more.

The theme for this year's festival was not just to learn more new dances, but to learn how to become a better dancer as well. Greg has 17 years experience as a ballroom dance instructor, in addition to teaching C/W line and couple dancing and swing dancing. He is a very versatile instructor, and we put him to good use.

The first dance he taught us was Strait Cha-Cha by SAL GONZALES. It's a nice easy cha-cha. After he taught us the steps, we had him teach us some Cuban hip motion technique. No matter how simple the dance, it will look alot better when danced with good style. That was our goal for the weekend. The second dance we did was Coastin' by RAY & TINA This dance is one that seems to be sweeping the YEOMAN. world and for good reason. It fits perfectly the Irish music from Lord of the Dance. We added our own optional arm movements to make it even more interesting. It's one of those dances where you just naturally want to get into the nice straight lines and dance very precicisely. After the festival, several people commented on how they actually started crying the last time we danced it just from the sheer joy of everyone dancing together in unison.

The next dance we learned was Got To Be Funky by DAWN BEACHUM. This is the exact opposite kind of dance where everyone should be doing their own thing and let it all hang out. I'm sure most everyone knows the frustration of being told by the instructor to just express yourself, however you want to here, for the next eight counts, and not knowing what to do. For people who are naturally creative with their bodies that's fine, but for most of us, we need some helpful suggestions. We got Greg to give us several styling options we could do to play with the dance a little. That made it alot more fun for everyone.

The last clance we learned on Saturday was Martha's Moonlight Waltz. This was choreographed by Greg especially for our festival and, blush, blush, in my honor. Excuse me for any unforgivable partiality, but this is one of the most beautiful waltz line clances I have ever seen or danced. It is unusual in that it has syncopations, but it flows wonderfully, and the more you dance it, the more you come to love it. After working on our basic waltz technique and learning how to use our arms to enhance the dance, everyone looked really great out on the dance floor. In between the workshops, we put on music for open dancing and during the dinner hour we had time for a little square and round dancing for those who know how. We also had reviews of the dances from the year's festival and ended up the day with an hour of just dancing all the dances we learned. After that, everyone trotted off to the nearest pub for a little refreshment.

We started off Sunday morning with a review of the previous day's dances and working out a little prank and play on Greg. (There are some advantages to being able to talk in Japanese and not have him understand us...) Greg is pretty tall and he really towered over the Japanese dancers. His nickname for the weekend was 'Godzila'. He even had some special t-shirts made up showing him holding a C/W dancer in his hand and striding through downtown Nagoya. "Oh No it's Godzilla" was written across the bottom. When he was introduced that morning he unsuspectingly walked out on stage, I yelled out "oh no", everyone else answered "it's Godzilla" and ran, screaming, out of the room in terror. Needless to say that wasn't quite the greeting Greg had been expecting - tee hee!

After that little bit of fun, we got down to work. Boy, were we put through the paces. Greg started out the morning teaching his new dance Jump, Jive & Wail. A real high energy line dance. The music is real fast and I was worried if everyone was going to be able to keep up, but, thanks to Greg's expert teaching, everyone did fine. Boy, did it get our heart rates raging. The next dance was also by Greg called Boulevard Boogie, a shag style line dance. This is a nice smooth-style dance, it really rounded out our workshops. All 6 of the workshop dances were different styles of dancing. We got to work in a variety of dance techniques over the weekend. I'm glad to say that everyone went home a better dancer.

During the lunch hour, we had some clogging exhibitions. A group form Tokyo did a demo of the latest dance they learned, Titanic by SIMON WARD. The afternoon was all review and general dancing. We danced each of the workshop dances at least 7 or 8 times over the course of the weekend so that people could really master the dances. the evening was devoted to a big after party. We like 'after' parties here! Some people go so far as to say they dance just so that they can really enjoy the 'after' party!

The third day was devoted to more advanced workshops. In the morning we worked on our west coast swing. Greg taught us some fun syncopations to play with that would spice up our basics. He also went around and danced with everyone in the room so they could really get the 'feel of it'. Then in the afternoon, we learned two new Scott Blevins dances. Walkin on Me and Latin Groove. As with all of Scott's dances, they were challenging at first, but felt so very good after you got them down. After the festival was over, we went and had... you guesses it, another 'after' party!

I think the best word that would sum up this year's festival would have to be "satisfying". We occasionally like to be challenged, not just with new dances, but with improved technique as well. This year, everyone went home replete!
