CPS is having a beginner dance workshop on May 16 to attract new dancers and potential members.


CPS is currently working on a demonstration routine with about 20 people practising weekly to prepare for summer engagements.

Due to the lack of space, we regret that we cannot invite all of you to our wedding supper, but you are certainly welcome to come to our ceremony and dance.


Country Pride will be running the cash bar and we would really appreciate a few volunteers to take turns selling tickets or running the bar from the start of the dance until the close.



The biggest news is our membership increasing incredibly fast! In Sept. and Oct. we had approx-





We are going to have a blast in Portland and we are looking forward to more dances come September. So, until next time have a great summer!


